- Manufacturing Execution Systems (MES) gather information about current conditions on the plant floor and help point to areas of improvement in the manufacturing process, optimizing output.

- MES provides traceability of materials, helping a company better manage its production systems and resources as well as preventing or limiting the scope of product recalls.

- ERP systems measure transactions in days, weeks and months. In contrast, an MES measures activity on the shop floor in hours, minutes and seconds, providing the user with simple-to-read information and cost-optimizing insights in real time.
